

03 | NATURAL BURIAL

Definitions of Natural Burial

Natural burial is the practice of burying a human body in the earth, in a manner that allows for natural decomposition with minimal impact on the surrounding ecosystem.

Primary Principles of Natural Burial

- Natural body care (no embalming)
- Dressed in natural fibres
- Coffin / shroud made from natural fibres
- Shallow grave - 1.2 metres deep
- No markings on the burial. After digging, the area is returned to natural bush.

Bushland unique to the surrounding area will be maintained and cultivated using plants indigenous to the local area. Over time the bushland will become a living and lasting natural commemoration. When families come to visit their loved ones they will be able to experience a beautiful bushland area as a natural memorial in its entirety.
